

The Patrizia Hanover Property Unit Trust (PHPUT) as owners of the Westcott Venture Park are seeking contractors who would be interested in tendering the next phase of new development on the park. The scheme is a partial pre-let to Satellite Applications Catapult and in consideration of their involvement and funding from the public purse there is a requirement for this notice to be publicly advertised to establish a tender list for the works.

Only contractors who can demonstrate that they can fulfil and exceed the minimum requirements set out herein should submit their expression of interest. The contractor will be expected to submit evidence with their expression of interest that they meet the minimum criteria as set out below.

Scope of Works

The Venture Park is located on the A41 between Bicester and Aylesbury.

The works comprise the construction of a new industrial unit which is subdivided into two separate units each with associated offices, part laboratories and staff facilities and forming workspace/warehouse area on a 0. 60-hectare (1.47 acre) site. The building formed of a steel portal framed construction with insulated metal cladding to the roof and walls and providing a clear height to underside of haunch of 8.0m It is anticipated that the scheme will provide a target total gross internal ground floor area of 23,290ft2 (2,164m2) and 2,700ft2 (258m2) at first floor. External site works shall comprise hardstanding/ yard, car parking, and associated landscaping and drainage. The build budget is circa £3m.

The works will be tendered on a JCT 2016 DB contract with amendments as drafted by the funds legal representatives, the contractor must demonstrate experience and knowledge of constructing similar projects under this form of contract.

Expectations of Contractors

Respondents will be asked to demonstrate their experience of delivering similar projects, suitability of their proposed team, lessons learnt from similar projects and details of their programme and organisation structure.

The client would like to hear from contractors who meet the following criteria:

- Are able to meet the proposed programme of 30 weeks on site
- Have experience of delivering at least 3 similar projects in each of the last 3 years.
- Have a turnover in excess of £25m per annum over the last 3 years.
- Provide a copy of your audited accounts for the last two years,
 - Are you able to provide one of the following:
 - A statement of the turnover, Profit and Loss Account/Income Statement, Balance Sheet/Statement of Financial Position and Statement of Cash Flow for the most recent year of trading for this organisation.
 - A statement of the cash flow forecast for the current year and a bank letter outlining the current cash and credit position.
 - Alternative means of demonstrating financial status if any of the above are not available (e.g., forecast of turnover for the current year and a statement of funding provided by the



owners and/or the bank, charity accruals accounts or an alternative means of demonstrating financial status).

- Hold the following insurances:

 - Professional indemnity £5m
 - Public liability £10m
 - o Employers £10m
- Have experience in delivering projects utilising the JCT Design and Build Contract.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the JCT 2016 D&B Contract and the novation of consultants to the main contractor
